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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 15th issue of the 2nd year of the President's News Digest.

I would like to start this issue of the President's News Digest by addressing the important subject of institutional accreditation.



Last week, the HEC met and they confirmed that the three universities that were part of the pilot study have achieved accreditation and affirmed that all remaining universities will need to go through the same process. This is good news for us as we have been working on the preparation of accreditation for the last eighteen months. The starting point will be submitting the accreditation application form. According to the accreditation handbook, we need to submit an accreditation application which will be scrutinised by the HEC within 4 weeks. If we pass the scrutinisation process, they will write to us to inform us about a panel visit and to submit the self-evaluation report and all supporting materials which will be due 4 weeks before the accreditation visit.



On the visit day, they will ask for additional documentation and they have provided us in appendix A of the accreditation handbook with all the documents that will be needed on the days

of the visit. Please note that the SER and all supporting materials will be submitted in English. Tania circulated again the previously disseminated accreditation handbook in both Arabic and English. All staff, academic and admin, should read the accreditation handbook in order to become familiar with the requirements.

There are 3 important areas that we need to pass which are: Governance, Administration and Management, and Teaching and Learning and Assessment. I am also sure that the panel will put a lot of emphasis on students' support. Please refer to the accreditation handbook to look at the areas, standards and key indicators that are required for accreditation purposes. The visiting panel will attend classes and observe the quality of teaching and learning. It is therefore vital to have top quality teaching material, excellent assessed work, and up to date course portfolios including course specifications.









They will be judging the quality of the delivery of teaching and how students are interacting with the teaching staff and each other in classes. Exciting and relevant teaching with clear weekly plans are essential to meet their requirements. The learning outcomes should be clearly stated and the students should be fully

aware of what they are going to achieve. Learning resources should be clearly identified including Moodle, library resources and teaching material references. The visiting panel with adopt a students centered approach and most of their questions will be related to how students are achieving learning outcomes and how we are supporting them. The following list summarises some important issues that need to be done properly:



- 1. Course portfolios, including course specification, syllabus, weekly study plans, relevant and up to date references and books.
- 2. Annual Programme Reviews Reports should be clearly drafted with clear action plans
- 3. University catalogue, students' handbook and program handbooks are up to date and clearly communicated to students whether they are printed or they are available on the web site.
- 4. The website should be kept up to date and it will be scrutinised at the accreditation application stage
- 5. All surveys are conducted and analysed and clear action plans are developed and followed to close the cycle
- 6. All committees are meeting according to plans with clear agendas, minutes and actions
- 7. All class observations are conducted and analysed and action plans are developed and followed
- 8. All staff recruitment employments are transparent and follow our staff recruitment policies and procedures
- 9. Students should be at the heart of all what we do and they should be supported and their voice is heard.
- 10. Strict quality assurance checks are in place in order to ensure that we are delivering work to the highest standards.
- 11. The areas of research, community engagement, and facilities should all be monitored and clear reports are produced about their performance.

As you are all aware, universities which do not achieve accreditation will not be able to operate in Bahrain. It is therefore vital for our long term existence and sustainability to achieve accreditation. This is a collective effort and we should all be contributing to the success of this very important activity. The accreditation group will intensify its efforts over the next couple of weeks in order to finalise the accreditation application and the self-evaluation report and supporting materials that need to be submitted to the HEC in due course.



Last week, the University witnessed another milestone in our area of internationalization. I would like to congratulate staff and students on the historical occasion of signing the memorandum of cooperation with Cardiff Metropolitan University, UK. The signing ceremony which took place on 9

February 2017 reflects the professionalism and high quality and standards we embrace in the University.









The ceremony was held under the patronage of the Secretary General of the HEC, and in the presence of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, HE the British Ambassador to Bahrain, the Secretary General of the Association of Arab Universities, Director of British Council, President and Vice Chancellor and Pro Vice Chancellor of Cardiff Met, and many important dignitaries. Under this MOC, ASU will deliver two Cardiff Met bachelor programmes in Management and Business Studies and Accounting and Finance. The graduates will receive their degrees from Cardiff Met. This is a golden opportunity for students to get a degree from a British University while saving on costs and not being away from family and friends. I would like to thank all staff and students who contributed to the success of this event, especially Ms Tania Kashou for the precise coordination and excellent management of the event and to Ms Ruqaya Mohsin for being an excellent MC.









Last week the President attended a conference in Oman hosted by Gulf College titled "Handling the global challenges for Middle East universities" and organized by ARELEN, Cardiff Metropolitan University and the Association of Arab Universities and facilitated by David Lock, Chief Executive of the Magna Charta. Presentations were made by the Chief Executive of the Leadership Foundation for Higher Education, Deputy President of University of Bologna, President and Pro Vice Chancellor of Cardiff Met, and Dean of Gulf College.

It appears that most universities in the Arab World are facing similar issues related to accreditation, use of traditional methods of teaching, lack of research, recruitment and retention of talented staff, the students' voice, quality assurance, use of technology, entrepreneurship and innovation, and capacity creation.

On 5 February, the Deanship of Students Affairs organised an orientation day for our new students. It is our duty to guide our students as they embark on a new learning experience. Let's make them feel welcome and support them and go the extra mile to provide them with pleasant learning experiences. 


