On Sunday, 15 January 2017, a workshop on student employability was organized by the University. The event was great and well received by the 60+ who attended it. It was really pleasing to see the Dome Room buzzing



with staff, external partners and most importantly our students who were passionate about contributing to the workshop.

The workshop started with a speech delivered by Prof Waheeb that



set the scene for the event. This was followed by a presentation by the President on our University's strategy. Prof Saad then presented our students employability strategy focusing on internal issues like internships, curriculum design, incubation, soft skills, etc. Dr Faiza next presented our Graduate Attributes taking

into account internal and external factors. The final presentation was by Dr Assem who presented market needs focusing on external factors like HEC guidelines, vision 2030, and international opportunities.

The workshop was run using a brainstorming approach to generate new and innovative ideas that can help our students to become more employable.

The results of the workshop will help our students and will be well received by the accreditation panel when they visit us. We intend to run this workshop again involving all staff and some selected students.

On 16 January, the University signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Flat 6 Labs to collaborate in the area of entrepreneurship and business incubators and accelerators. Ms Sabah Almoayed, Member of the HEC council, signed the agreement on behalf of Flat 6 Labs and in the presence of the Chairman of the BOT and many senior colleagues from across the University.

On 17 January, the Board of Trustees chaired by Prof Waheeb Alkhaja held its second meeting this year. The President gave a presentation about the University's progress in the areas of accreditation, change management, strategic and operational planning and KPIs. In addition, the President presented ASU's achievements this year and the plans put in place to dealing with challenges facing the University especially in the area of programme reviews and quality assurance. The BOT has approved all minor amendments to policies, bylaws and organizational charts.

Last week the University was buzzing with many visitors including HE the Italian Ambassador to Bahrain, Mr Don Ward, the Chief Executive of Constructing Excellence UK, the CEO and founder of Challenger team Dr Thabet Nabulsi, sales representatives from Oman Air, and Marise Santos from Red House Marketing, to explore opportunities for collaboration.
