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## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Welcome to the 9th issue of the 3rd year of the President's News Digest.

I would like to start this issue by wishing you a very Happy New Year. I sincerely hope that 2018 will bring you and your families (staff and students) happiness, success and prosperity. 2018 is an important year for the University as accreditation of our University by the HEC will take place during this year and we have to be well prepared for it.

In this issue, I will be covering the subject of students' motivation, which has been researched over the last thirty years, but it is still a hot topic. Student motivation drives academic performance in universities and schools and it is important to design learning environments that enable students to aspire for success. Motivation is the energy that drives behavior and performance resulting in a very enjoyable learning experience for our students.

Maslow's hierarchy of needs model (1943), which includes: the physiological, safety, love and belongingness, esteem and self-actualization is all about motivation. Higher education is the best place for people to achieve esteem and self-actualization by acquiring relevant knowledge and status. Through self-actualization, students can realize their potential and ultimate abilities.

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln lists few tips on students motivation: know your students' names and use their names as often as possible; plan for every class and never try to wing it; pay attention to the strengths and limitations of each of your students and reward their strengths and strengthen their weaknesses; if possible, set your room in a U-shape to encourage interaction among students; vary your instructional strategies: use lectures, demonstrations, discussions, case studies, groups, and more; review the learning objectives with your students and be sure that students know what they are expected to learn, do, know, etc; move around the room as you teach; make your classes relevant and be sure students see how the content relates to them and the world around them; be expressive and smile; put some excitement into your speech and vary your pitch, volume and rate; give lots of examples; encourage students to share their ideas and comments, even if they are incorrect and you'll never know what students don't

understand unless you ask them; maintain eye contact and move toward your students as you interact with them and nod your head to show that you are listening to them; provide opportunities for students to speak to the class; be available before class starts, during break, and after class to visit with students; return assignments and tests to students as soon as reasonably possible and provide constructive feedback; be consistent in your treatment of students; make sure that your exams are current, valid, and reliable; tie your assessment to your course objectives; plan around 15-20 minute cycles as students have difficulty maintaining attention after a longer period of time; involve your students in your teaching and ask for feedback.

It is very important to understand that students come from different backgrounds and varying abilities and they have different learning styles as a result of their social upbringing, schooling and the academic disciplines they are studying for. It is therefore of crucial importance to know your students and how they learn and what they care about. We should be students centered, but this is not enough without demonstrating that we have the knowledge, experience, and style in dealing with our students. We need to motivate them to perform better and we need to praise them when they do well. We should avoid to discourage them or to criticize them when they are not performing well as they could be having family, health or personal problems. We need to show empathy and we should treat them as people who are capable of achieving well.

We need to work tirelessly to create a challenging, innovative, nurturing and rewarding environment for our students. In addition, we need to show respect to our students and greet them with warmth, affection and enthusiasm in order to motivate them. Creating a sense of belonging and setting high expectations demonstrated through our love and passion for our profession should be our top priority and this will help us in creating a motivated students community.

It is widely known that students fail mainly because of lack of motivation and problems with their home life. It is our duty as educationalists to provide students with proper counseling and coaching in order to help them overcome their problems and to focus more on their academic achievements. I strongly believe that through motivation and encouragement we can help our students achieve much better. Combining qualities like professionalism, integrity, strong knowledge of the subject, motivation and encouragement, and passion for our profession can help our students in developing similar values and succeed
