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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 47th issue of the 3rd year of the President's News Digest.

In this issue of the News Digest, I will address the subject of "being reflective" which is a big requirement in the forthcoming institutional review.



As you are aware, the forthcoming institutional review is based around 8 standards, which have been covered in past issues of the President's News Digest. It is essential as part of institutional review to become more reflective about every activity you do including teaching. Closing the loop is the result of being reflective which is mainly used for teaching purposes. However, it is important to close the loop when you conduct surveys, chair committee meetings, develop new policies, implement action plans and check progress for various activities like strategic and operational planning.

Being reflective implies that we are assessing a situation, measuring the impact and documenting our reflective processes. Preparation of course portfolios, annual and periodic program reviews, submission of HEA applications require reflective sections to assess what you have achieved and how you can improve things.

It is vital for all of us to be well prepared for the forthcoming BQA intuitional review visit. If we adopt a strong culture of "being reflective" encompassing a "closing the loop" approach we will sail through such a review. We have to be rigorous, reflective, and determined to close the loop for everything we do. It is easy to start things, but it is more difficult to complete them. However, we need the mindset to complete tasks in a professional way that we will lead to benefits to our students and other stakeholders. The students' learning experience will be enhanced immensely if we become more reflective and if we close the loop for everything we do.

Dr. Al-Hamami Delivered a Lecture to Friendship Society for the Blind Bahrain

On 8 September 2018, Dr. Mohammad Alaa Hussain Al-Hamami delivered a lecture entitled "The Alphabet of Social Media" to the friends and members of Friendship Society for the Blind Bahrain.



He mentioned that the number of Facebook users in Bahrain reached more than 800,000 users, more than 500,000 Instagram users, and more than 250,000 Twitter users. Dr. Al-Hamami clarified that there are more than 3 billion users in social media platforms, around 1 of 3 marriages globally started online. Facebook is considered to be the largest country in earth in terms of users; 53% of the millennium generation prefer to lose their sense of smell instead of losing the technology they use! 93% of purchasing decisions are influenced by social media, humans have more mobile phones than toothbrushes, and what is published on social media platforms technically could not be deleted.

4. What do you enjoy most about your job?

I enjoy the sincere appreciation I receive from not only my manager but also the colleagues. A genuine "thank you" goes a long way toward improving my attitude and productivity.

5. Tell us about your hobbies

Writing, drawing and swimming.

6. Tell us about your favourite food

My mom is a great role model when it comes to family meals.

7. Tell us about the book you are reading now

Dr. Al-Hamami said that God has honored humans to make them live in communities, therefore social media platforms find great popularity worldwide. As the number of Facebook users globally reached more than 2 billion users, and more than 700 million users on Instagram, the number of Twitter users reached more than 400 million users, statistics show that grandparents are the fastest growing demographic on Twitter, noting that Instagram is the most widely platform used in the Kingdom of Bahrain due to the high interaction and engagement between its accounts.

Dr. Al-Hamami also explained the types of cyber-crimes; he warned writing unnecessary personal information at social media platforms. He pointed out that electronic crimes should be reported to Cyber Crime Directorate, and stress on the importance of reading the privacy policy of social media platforms because some kinds of platforms may not be suitable for some users.
