The total number of students applying for the fund reached 74. All students were interviewed individually and were given the opportunity to explain their situations and the reasons

behind putting forwards their applications. The role of the committee is to look into all applications and give recommendations to the prime Student Fund Committee.

The initial filtration was based over a set of criteria and requirements as dictated in the Student Support fund policy.

WORK SESSION ON INSTITUTIONAL RESEARCH AND EFFECTIVENESS

On Thursday, 27 September 2018, ASU held a work session at its Technology Building about putting in place an Institutional Research Information System (IRIS) and the steps needed to do it effectively. The session was attended by key staff of the University including the top management.



This comes at a very opportune timing as ASU is at the pinnacle of institutional self-awareness after a well-conducted institutional accreditation exercise. Indeed, setting an Institutional research & effectiveness strategy is the best way to retain and institutionalize the staggering amount of information, measurements and evidences gathered during the preparation for the accreditation.





The session started with a general definition of the discipline of institutional research. In fact, it is defined as the activity carried out in colleges and universities to collect and analyze data concerning students, faculty, staff, and other educational facilities. The primary purpose of institutional research is to promote institutional effectiveness (Education Encyclopedia). It helps with institutional planning, policy formation and implementation, decision-making,

and providing evidence for assessment exercises (program reviews, institutional effectiveness reviews, accreditation exercises, other of regulatory compliance).

The session then dived deeper into the detailed tasks to be performed in the context of Institutional Research and the functions of a typical Institutional Research and Effectiveness (IRE) office or unit. Furthermore, the attendees brainstormed about how to capture all the gathered information into an Institutional Research Information System (IRIS) that reflects the University's performance in its various areas of academic delivery and administrative provision both accurately and effectively. The ICT&KM Directorate at ASU will play a major role in this regard.

As the session progressed, it became clear that this is a very ambitious project that will help the University have a documented organization of all its institutional effectiveness related data and ensure better communication and transparency about institutional data internally and externally. As a result, this will help immensely with the expected BQA Institutional Review.

At the end, the participants agreed on a tentative timeline for the IRIS development, the steps required to do so, and set a date for a next session which should be in mid-November 2018. areas covered and timing of each event.
