
I would like to thank Professor Waheeb Al-Khaja, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, for his vision and continuous support and also thank all contributors who have helped a

THE DEANSHIP OF RESEARCH AND GRADUATE STUDIES HELD ITS FIRST ACTIVITY

Under the patronage of Professor Ghassan Aouad, President of Applied Science University, and in line with the University's strategic plan and workshop series, the Deanship of Research and Graduate Studies held its first workshop for the academic year 2018/2019 on Monday, 15 October 2018 titled "Discussions on HEC Requirements about Master's Theses." The Deanship invited Dr Assem Al-Hajj, Vice President for Academic Affairs and Development, to deliver the workshop.



Professor Yazeed Al-Sbou, the Dean of Research and Graduate studies, welcomed the audience and gave a brief about graduate studies in the University and stressed the significant role of both the supervisor and the student in achieving distinguished theses.



In his talk, Dr Assem spoke about the importance of the workshop to guide supervisors, students and internal and external examiners about the process of completion of good quality theses. In addition, Dr Assem discussed some points highlighted by the HEC regarding this subject, including chairing the assessment panel and conforming with the regulations, achieving the conditions of supervision on the master's thesis, the novelty and importance



of the subject of master's thesis to the Kingdom of Bahrain, student's competence, updating the Manual of preparing master's thesis, weakness of some master's theses... etc.



The University President, Professor Ghassan Aouad, concluded the workshop and stressed the importance of the quality of the master's theses and publishing research articles

related to these theses in well-recognised journals and conferences. In addition, the President highlighted the importance of the University's master's programmes.

The audience enjoyed the workshop and the wide discussions, which covered issues related to graduate studies and programmes. In addition, academic members shared their ideas and proposed constructive ideas for future research.

In addition, many of the workshops were practical in nature and full of great hands-on activities.

The second plenary session, "Storytelling: The Definitive 21st Century Skill" saw Mr. Jamie Keddie captivate the audience with his witty storytelling techniques. Besides an emphasis on the importance of stories as a means to entertain, strengthen bonds, persuade and communicate ideas; the session also stressed the need for all teachers to develop their own style of storytelling as a way to engage students and get them involved in discussions.

Russel Stannard closed the day's proceedings with a presentation on how technologies are impacting teaching and learning. He left the audience with the message that it is the educator's role to be aware of the ever-changing advances in technology and to integrate them wherever possible.

The whole conference was a great success and a wonderful way to meet and interact with other ELT professionals.

The Training, Development and Continuing Education Centre at ASU has organized a series of training courses for its administrative staff. These courses, were organized to help uplift the skills of the administrative staff who attended the course. More details are listed below:

1. Mrs. Ruqaya Mohsen received her certificate for Digital marketing from ICDL. She is now an authorized instructor and tester for ICDL's - Digital Marketing syllabus. This module sets out essential concepts and skills relating to the fundamentals of digital marketing, including creating a web presence, optimising content for search engines, using social media platforms, carrying out online marketing and advertising across a range of services, as well as monitoring and improving campaigns using analytics.



2. Mr. Abbas Abdulla Sarhan, Dr. Ammar Esam Al Sammarraee, Ms. Hadeel Ahmed Bucheerei and Ms. Khadija Nadheer Shakeeb participated and completed the HABC Level 2 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work. (QCF) course.













This qualification is for those learners who are already working or preparing to work in an industry and that has been identified within the company's risk assessment of First Aid and supports the role in the workplace as a First aider. Topics within this course are regarded as important in maintaining good practice in the safe, prompt and effective treatment of injuries and ill health in the workplace. The qualification provides learners with the knowledge, understanding and skills in First Aid.

3. The MEDIC First Aid Basic Plus is a combined adult CPR, AED, and first aid training program designed specifically for all the occupational first aid providers. This extremely flexible program helps employers meet OSHA and other federal and state regulatory







requirements for training employees how to respond and care for medical emergencies at work. Shatha Yaseen, Muneera Alshawi, Ebrahim Hasan, Noushad hameed, Noor Abdulla, Latifa Fandi and Abdulhameed Baqi were the employees from various departments that underwent this training and are now certified first aid providers.

4. SPSS is the acronym of Statistical Package for the Social Science. SPSS is one of the most popular statistical packages which can perform highly complex data manipulation and analysis with simple instructions. It is designed for both interactive and





non-interactive uses. It is used by researchers to perform statistical analysis. The course was held from 1-4 October 2018. It was conducted by Arabian Gulf University in Association with Tamkeen. Mona Albanna, Hadeel Bucheerei, Fatema Mohamed, Latifa Fandi, Muna Bashook, Wafa Saleh, Noora Ismaeel and Maryam Mohamed attended the course.
