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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 16th issue of the 4th year of the President's News Digest. In this issue of the News Digest, I will address the subject of "creating a research culture".



In order to create a research culture within a

university, it is important to address the drivers and motivation at individual, institutional and national levels. At the individual level, the motivation drivers include academic promotion, recognition, rewards, academic reputation, fame, publications and citations, research feeding into teaching, scholarly activities, publications with master students, publications with national and international collaborators, and leaving a legacy. At institutional level, these include strategic plan, University bylaws, research and graduate studies handbooks, QS rankings, solving Industrial Problems, academic reputation, research expenditure, research feeding into teaching, scholarly activities, graduate studies, and the fact that research is what makes universities unique. Finally at national level, the drivers and motivation include Vision 2030, HEC strategies, HEC bylaws, accreditation and quality reviews, entrepreneurship and innovation, QS rankings, solving industrial problems, academic reputation, research expenditure, and economic and social impact.

Creating a research culture depends on the ability to generate research capacity. Some hints are provided below:

- Perform Environment Scanning, internal and external
- Identify up to 5 research areas and assess strategic match
- Identify champions
- Perform brain storming sessions and build a network of like minded researchers and practitioners
- Assess reputation and credibility, create critical mass
- Assess financial viability
- Produce a long term sustainability plan including research income, Master students, new courses, commercialisation opportunities (total solutions)
- Mobilise resources, start bidding, high level conferences involving policy makers, industry, funding bodies, etc



In the 2014 Hanover Research Report, some guidelines are provided of how to create a research culture:

- A culture of research requires both institutional and unit based leaders to set clear research goals and communicate them effectively
- Institutions wishing to develop a culture of research must allocate significant resources for faculty training and support
- A developing culture of research requires open and collaborative personal relationships among faculty members
- To implement cultural change, administrators must be prepared to tailor resource allocations based on faculty members' current motivations and abilities
- A culture of research may take years to develop and, once established, requires regular maintenance
- Plans for a culture of research should include consideration of student involvement.

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Some hints are provided below of how to maximize the number and quality of outputs as part of creating a research culture:

- Create Research groups and initiate projects and align your Masters students with these groups and projects
- Publish with your Masters students
- Publish with your international partners, LSBU, Cardiff Met
- Pairing with well established colleagues
- Establish links with industrial and government collaborators
- Do not complain about time shortage, doing research is a privilege
- Do rigorous and high quality research which is useful and original
- Submit a paper to our International Conference
- Publicize your research in order to create more impact and to maximize the number of citations
- Always remember to be ethical in conducting high quality research

1. Tell us about yourself: (Your childhood, academic background)

I was born in Baghdad, Iraq. I went to primary school in Baghdad, but I did my secondary school in Basra.

In 1977, I graduated from University of Baghdad, with a BSc. in Civil Engineering.

A VISIT TO THE ARAB REGIONAL CENTER FOR WORLD HERITAGE



The Interior Design students visited the Arab Regional Center for World Heritage as part of their activities focused on the rehabilitation of historical

buildings. The students attended an exhibition on the Heritage of Urban and Architectural Innovations in the Arab World. It presented an overview of the heritage of modern architecture in the Arab world of the 20th Century, through demonstrating the most prominent urban examples from all Arab countries. The exhibition was co-prepared by the UNESCO World Heritage Center, the National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters in Kuwait and the Arab Center for Architecture in Lebanon, with the aim of raising awareness of the importance of modern heritage as a testament to the evolution of human thought reflected in modern architecture.

The students also participated in a discussion with Dr. Anas Soufan, a world heritage expert who presented a lecture on Damascus entitled "The Architectural Environment of Damascus: Westernization, Originality and Modernity". The lecture addressed the status of urban changes in Damascus, the thousands-years lively city, and talked about its origins, characteristics, makers and luminaries.
