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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 17th issue of the 4th year of the President's News Digest. In this issue of the News Digest, I will address the subject of “Emotional Intelligence as part of the employability of graduates”.



Emotional Intelligence plays an important role in the area of graduate employability. Emotional Intelligence is concerned with the ability to perceive, understand and manage emotion, both in ourselves and others. It is therefore important to enable our students and graduates to be emotionally intelligent in order to cope with a fast developing and complex market market place. Our graduates will become one-day future leaders in industry and government, and we should equip them with emotional intelligence skills.

The skills and techniques for emotional intelligence may be developed throughout someone's life as part of lifelong learning and would form the foundation for a balanced lifestyle. Students and graduates should, however, be taught about emotional intelligence in order to cope with stresses in their personal and career lives. The curriculum should include parts about emotional intelligence and our students should be exposed to some training in this area.

Academic leaders are challenged on a daily basis to ensure that they are delivering a second to none student experience to their students. In addition, they are expected to improve the quality of teaching and research and they are facing varying demands from staff and students and external bodies. These challenges will often require a different set of skills and emotions. As a result, they are becoming aware that working in an emotion-filled context requires a special set of skills, and have recognized the importance of Emotional Intelligence (EI) for leading their people. These skills should be passed to our graduates in order to enable them to become capable graduates who can meet the complexity of real life and working environments.

Applied Science University Visited Shura Council



On Sunday, 17 February 2019, the Community Engagement Office in cooperation with the College of Law and the Department of Political Science organised a visit to Shura Council in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

A number of academic and administrative staff and students took part in the visit and attended one part of the weekly council session. A brief lecture was given to them explaining the origins and mechanisms of legislative work and the legislative relationship between the Shura and the House of Representatives, and



how the proposals of laws and projects shall be subject to the laws and the legislative mechanism for discussion. A tour to the Council library took place, in addition to attending a management session to learn about the mechanism for preparing session moderators.
