The Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face, including those related to poverty, inequality, climate, environmental degradation, prosperity, and peace and justice. The Goals interconnect and in order to leave no one behind, it is important that we achieve each Goal and target by 2030.

THE GLOBAL GOALS

For Sustainable Development



The 17 goals are all very relevant to universities across the globe, and ASU is no difference. We should design our curriculum to address some of these goals. In addition, we should educate our staff and students about these important goals through training and awareness workshops. Specific goals like quality education, affordable and clean energy, decent work and economic growth, industry and innovation and infrastructure, sustainable cities and communities, and climate action are of particular importance.

It is our duty to produce graduates that care about the environment in a world, which is competing, for scarce resources. Our staff should take the lead in demonstrating to our students how to become more efficient and more sustainable. Many universities have developed sustainability strategies to address this important area.



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In our University, we should have a framework that guides our performance in this area. This framework should cover 4 important pillars, the first one is related to energy use, green issues, and sustainable buildings and campuses, the second pillar is related to the use of technology, the third one is associated with economic sustainability, and the last one is related to social and behavioral habits. On the environmental side, we should become more efficient by relying more on natural lighting, switching devices when they are not in use, avoiding printing documents when they are not needed in order to save on costs and trees, switching off the lights and AC when we are not in our offices, recycling of waste water and use of solar panels if feasible. A green campus should always be our biggest dream. In the area of technology, we should automate most of our processes in order to become more efficient and to reduce the consumption of printing materials. Centralized printing is now the norm in most universities. The economic sustainability could be addressed by relying more on our internal talents and the efficient use of external resources through rigorous procurement approaches. Finally, with regards to the social and behavioral habits, our staff and students should embrace the idea of car sharing; this will help in the efficient use of the car park and savings on fuel consumption. In addition, it is important to embed sustainability in our culture and thinking and our curriculum should incorporate some issues related to sustainability.

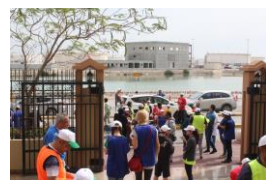
