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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 28th issue of the 4th year of the President's News Digest. In this issue I will be reporting on receiving the accreditation certificate from HE the Minister of Education, Dr Majid Bin Ali Al- Nuaimi.



On 7 May, HE the Minister of Education in Bahrain awarded the certificates of accreditation to the three institutions, that have undertaken institutional accreditation's inspection by the HEC in association with the British Accreditation Board, namely ASU, RCSI and AMA in the presence of the Secretary General of the HEC, and the Chair of the Academic Accreditation Committee and its members. It was a day to remember, as the HE Minister was full of praise for achieving institutional accreditation by the aforementioned institutions. On the same day, the University celebrated this fantastic achievement by holding a staff meeting



that was attended by the Chair of the BOTs and many colleagues. It is such a fantastic achievement, which is dedicated to Professor Waheeb for his big vision and great leadership.

What does it mean to be an accredited university? It means a lot; I am just listing few benefits:

1. It is a stamp of quality. It is an HEC Accreditation in association of an international organisation, the British Accreditation Board

2. Our students are now studying and will graduate from an accredited university

3. We will be listed on the HEC register of accredited universities
