MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 39th issue of the 4th volume of the President's News Digest. In this issue of the News Digest, I will address the subject of "Evaluation of Teaching Performance".



Informal evaluation of teaching which is a vital part of the educational process dates back to the fifteenth century, when students at the University of Bologna paid instructors according to their teaching abilities. Many research studies have since then been conducted especially in the last century about student evaluation of lecturers/instructors, but no definitive answers have been reached regarding the effectiveness of this approach.

The evaluation of universities lecturers by students on a semester basis is widely practiced by many universities across the globe. The outcomes from such evaluation are useful in developing staff development strategies as an aid to staff performance improvement and to address any shortcomings or weaknesses identified by the students.

The instrument used to gather information about a lecturer's teaching performance is usually a questionnaire survey that it is distributed (usually available online) and filled in by the students of the lecturer/instructor being evaluated. The content and timing of the survey are important parts of this evaluation. This should be supplemented by other means like peer review of teaching and evaluation of course portfolios amongst many others. Reliance on just one instrument is questionable as research has shown that students tend to praise lecturers who awarded them good grades.

"TAKE" 2019 CONFERENCE THEORY AND APPLICATIONS IN THE KNOWLEDGE ECONOMY – 3-5 JULY 2019 VIENNA, AUSTRIA.



Dr Radwan Kharabsheh from the Department of Business Administration at ASU participated in the "TAKE 2019 Conference" which was held in Vienna, Austria. The conference was hosted by the Institute for Applied Research on Skilled Crafts and Trades (IAGF), based in the Austrian Federal Economic Chamber (WKÖ), and co-organized by the WU Vienna University of Economics and Business, Research Group Knowledge-Based Management.



TAKE is an international scientific conference devoted to the multidisciplinary study of the knowledge economy. In particular, it intends to analyze the relation and the gap between theories and practices in the knowledge economy of the 21st century, thus, bringing together researchers, practitioners, and industry experts to discuss, advance, and shape the future of the knowledge economy.

The conference received more than 200 academic papers and had 70 accepted and presented in the conference that was delivered on 5 tracks. Dr Kharabsheh presented a paper titled "The mediating effect of learning orientation, proactive market orientation and absorptive capacity on the relationship between entrepreneurial orientation and organizational performance" and chaired numerous sessions in the conference.
