A decision support system (DSS) is a computer based information system that is used to enable decision makers take the right decisions. Within a university context, a decision support system is needed to deal with issues related to admissions and registration, student’s progression and retention, marketing, and staff recruitment amongst many others.

A good decision support system relies heavily on the quality of data and information as rubbish in is rubbish out. It allows proper planning, forecasting of future student numbers, and identification of new academic programs, and research trends.

When decisions makers are faced with a vast amount of information and a variety of options, a good decision system will allow them to do data mining which can help them in taking the right decisions.

The first decision support systems used techniques like expert system (rule based approach) and case base reasoning. However, recent advancements in the area of artificial intelligence will lead to the development of more reliable decision support systems.

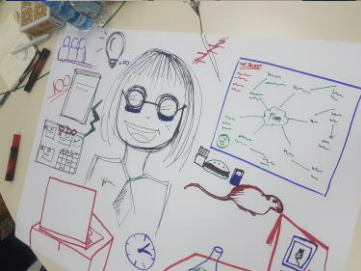

On Thursday 17 October 2019, the ICT&KM Directorate organized a workshop facilitated by Ms. Shadia and Mr. Rasheed, in collaboration with the Acting Secretary General of University Council, to help the Office Managers of the Colleges and Deanships and the minute-takers of University-level committees and councils to upload all the minutes of meetings of the previous academic year

(2018/2019) onto the new Committees Archiving and Management Tool.

The session was interactive and practical as the participants brought the minutes to upload and started uploading with help and guidance from Ms. Shadia and Mr. Rasheed.

The tool will play a major role in enhancing the effectiveness and the communication between the committees as it will enable all the concerned parties to follow, almost in real time, the proceedings, actions and decisions of the various committees and councils of the University.

Developed during the academic year 2018/2019, this tool will be fully deployed in the current academic year (2019/2020) and all the agendas and minutes of meetings will be stored in the tool as soon as they get produced.

Additional features of the tool will include an active workflow system that will allow the Committee Chair to assign tasks to other committee members or colleagues and monitor its progress and implementation status.

Finally, it is worth noting that this tool is part of a bigger system called “Information and Documentation Center”, a strategic project helmed by the ICT&KM Directorate that will help the University manage its documentation in a secure, paperless and sustainable way.
