- Since joining Applied Science University in November 2014, I have been leading the University through team working and collaboration to achieve outstanding results that has put ASU on the international map, namely through the following achievements:Developing two ambitious Strategic Plans 2015-2020 and 2020-2025.
- Engaging with policy makers at national, regional and international levels.
- Achieving the Institutional Accreditation from the Higher Education Council (HEC) in the Kingdom of Bahrain.
- Passing the Institutional Review by the Education & Training Quality Authority (BQA) in the Kingdom of Bahrain.
- Achieving the Global Accreditation from the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education (QAA) in the UK (only 13 universities in the world achieved it at the time we achieved it).
- Successful Institutional Listing of the University on the NQF Register.
- Achieving "Full Confidence" for all the academic programs undergoing BQA Program Reviews.
- On track for successful Placement of all academic programs of the University on the NQF Register.
- Achieving the official Academic Recognition from the Ministry of Education in Jordan, Syria, and KSA
- Featuring on the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings with improved ranking from 401-600 in 2021 to 201-300 in 2022.
- Featuring on the QS World University Rankings at 561-570 in 2023 (1st in Bahrain).
- ◆ Featuring on the QS Arab Region Universities Rankings with improved rankings from 37 in 2020 to 29 in 2021 to 22 in 2022 and 19 in 2023 (1st in Bahrain).
- Featuring on the QS Top 50 under 50 Rankings at 101-150 in 2021 (1st and only in Bahrain).
- Featuring on the QS Graduate Employability Ranking at 501-550 in 2022 (1st and only in Bahrain)
- Achieving 5 Stars in the QS Stars Rating system (only university in Bahrain).
- Featuring on the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings with improved rankings over the years from 636 in 2019 to 484 in 2020 to 459 in 2021.
- Featuring on the QS Subject Rankings 2022 at 101-150 for Art and Design.
- Ranking 3rd in Bahrain and 4934 in the world in the international Ranking Web of Universities (webometrics).
- The 1st and only University in Bahrain and the Gulf region to achieve both ISO 9001:2015 (for Quality Management Systems) and ISO 21001:2018 (for Educational Organizations Management Systems) certifications.
- ♦ Becoming an Accredited Centre by Advance HE (British professional membership scheme promoting excellence in higher education) to train ASU staff members to get the HEA Fellowship in its different categories (ASU currently has over 100 HEA Fellows and achieved 154 recognitions).
- The number of alumni has reached 6593 from local and hosted programs.
- Consistent increase of research publications over the years: from 105 research papers in 2017/2018 (including 47 articles in Scopus/ISI) to 215 research papers (and counting) in 2021/2022 (including 152 articles in Scopus/ISI) and 314 in 2022-2023 (209 publications in Scopus).

- ◆ Achieving outstanding results in Student Competitions: INJAZ Best Company Winner in 2019 in Bahrain, Product of the Year Award by Injaz Al Arab in 2019, 1st Place in Climate Champions Competition in 2022, winning in Universities sports competitions organized by Bahrain Collegiate Athletic Association (Champions in Football in 2019 and 3rd place in 2022, Runners-up in Volleyball in 2019 and 2022), 1st place Award for Community Engagement (Youth Category) by the Capital Governorate, etc.
- Awarded the Best Decorated Building in the Educational Field for 7 years in a row by the Capital Governorate.
- Successful delivery of British Programmes (hosted) in Bahrain in partnership with London South Bank University (LSBU) with the first cohort having graduated in 2021.
- Several participations at regional and international conferences representing ASU and promoting Higher Education in Bahrain on the global stage, such as chairing the QS Maple Annual Conference 2022 (QS Higher Ed Summit: Middle East & Africa) in Dubai (1-3 March 2022), among many others.

- Celebrating the Global Entrepreneurship Week (GEW) in collaboration with TAMKEEN by organizing a seminar on funding opportunities for young entrepreneurs in Bahrain.
- ♦ International Conference on Sustainable Futures (ICSF) 2017: a major international conference organized in November 2017 by ASU, London South Bank University (UK) and the Chartered Institute of Building, under the Patronage of His Excellency the Minister of Education.
- ◆ International Conference on Innovation, Technology, Enterprise and Entrepreneurship (ICITEE) 2019: a major international conference organized in November 2019 by ASU in association with London South Bank University (UK) and the Chartered Institute of Building.
- ◆ International Conference in Emerging Technologies for sustainability and Intelligent Systems (ICETIS) 2022: a major international conference that will be organized on 22-23 June 2022 by ASU in association with IEEE.
- ♦ International Conference on the Leadership and Management of Projects in the Digital Age (ICLMAP) 2022: a major international conference that was organized on 27-28 November 2022 by ASU in association with London South Bank University (UK).
- Participating in all the Association of Arab Universities meetings in order to raise the University's profile.
- Chairing the CIOB professional body and consequently recognized by Loughborough University (did his PhD there) to be awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Technology in 2016.
- Producing 374 copies of the News Digest on a weekly basis for the last 7 years

"Academic Publication Rules and International Classification"

In the presence of His Excellency Prof. Ghassan Aouad, President of the University, the Deanship of Research and Graduate Studies organized, on Sunday 12/25/2022, a virtual scientific seminar entitled "Academic Publication Rules and International Classification" delivered by Prof. Mahmoud Abdel-Aty, Head of the Arab Impact Factor and Vice President of the African Union for Mathematics.

The seminar included several topics through which the lecturer talked about methods of writing research in classified journals, the rules and standards of the international classification of scientific journals, Arab journals classified in international databases, rules for classifying journals in the Arab Impact Factor, open source journals, and academic blackmail. The seminar was attended by a number of faculty members at the university.


