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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 20th issue of the 4th year of the President's News Digest. In this issue of the News Digest, I will address the subject of "the fourth industrial revolution and the role of Higher Education"



The fourth industrial revolution is the current and developing environment in which disruptive technologies and trends such as the Internet of Things (IoT), robotics, virtual reality (VR) and artificial intelligence (AI) are changing the way we live and work.

Major transformations have been witnessed in progressing from the agricultural/agrarian to the current knowledge society. The industrial revolution, which spanned over a period from 1750 to 1850 was driven by the mechanization and automation of certain processes and products where changes in agriculture, manufacturing, mining, transportation, and technology had a profound effect on the social, economic and cultural conditions of the times. The information society then followed the industrial revolution culminating in the concept of the knowledge economy, which was first used by Peter Druker in 1969. Fifty years later the concept of knowledge societies is still evolving and encompassing many dimensions including the digital transformation and a fourth industrial revolution has started under the name of the automation economy.

How universities should respond to the demands of the automation economy and the fourth industrial revolution?


