
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



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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to the 24th issue of the 4th year of the President's News Digest. I will address the subject of "the ASU HEA accredited centre".







ASU has had collaboration with Advance-HE/HEA since 2015, as part of ASU's commitment to the goals of Bahrain to enhance education and teaching in the Kingdom and in the region. As a result of this partnership, 44 ASU staff have achieved an Advance-HE fellowship (11 Senior Fellows, 30 Fellows and 3 Associate Fellows). This total is already the highest of any private university in Bahrain and the accreditation of ASU's own scheme together with the establishment of the ASUrise HEA Fellowship Scheme Centre means that ASU is well on track towards its strategic target of 100% of teaching staff to hold fellowships.



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The ASUrise HEA centre has started offering the Fellowship Scheme from 2018/19. Almost 50 staff attended the Introductory Workshop at the end of October 2018 that was delivered by the ASDU (Academic Staff Development Unit) and there will be two cohorts in 2018/19 (a total of 20 staff) will have the chance to be to submit for fellowship recognition by HEA.

It is pleasing that all our colleagues in the first cohort have successfully passed their fellowship status:

- 2 Senior fellows without amendments
- 2 Fellows without amendments
- 3 Associate fellows without amendments
- 2 with some amendments, one minor (new approved) and one major

I would like to congratulate all participants of Cohort 1 and to thank their mentors and reviewers for doing a great job. I would also like to thank Dr Faiza Zitouni for leading the scheme, Dr Fiona Smart for her guidance and unwavering support, Dr Adel AlSamman and Ms Michelle Philip. Prof Hilal as chair of the ASUrise board is greatly acknowledged and Ms Catherine for acting as an observer on the Board.

This is a dream, which has come true since Prof Waheeb and I signed the contract with the HEA some years back. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Prof Waheeb for his unlimited support and great vision.

In total we have now 44 and 1 pending in the grades of associate fellows, fellows, and senior fellows of the HEA (please look at the list at the end of this issue of the President's News Digest). This is fantastic news for the University, as this accreditation makes ASU one of only few centres in the region that are accredited by the Advance HE. The work done with Advance HE (former HEA) since 2015 and the development of our own ASUrise HEA Fellowship Scheme are strategic investments in staff development to enhance ASU's provision, because Advance HE recognition is a visible acknowledgment of the quality of teaching and supporting student learning.

TRAINING WORKSHOP ON RISK MANAGEMENT AS PER ISO 31000:2018

On Saturday 13 April 2019, ASU organised a professional training workshop for members of its academic and administrative staff



on risk management as per the guidelines of the ISO 31000:2018 Standard.



The training was offered by AJA Europe, a renowned certification and inspection body based in Manama, and the session was

delivered by Mr. S. M. Mobin, a Lead Auditor and Lead Tutor in Quality Management Systems and a Risk Management Professional.

4. What do you enjoy most about your job?

I like teaching, and I love finance as a subject of science and art. Working in academia inspires me to be aware of the developments in the world.

The workshop was all hands-on and very interactive, and the attendees had the chance to learn the fundamentals/principles of risk management, the framework, and the process of risk management.

One takeaway the learners won't forget is the definition of risk: the impact of uncertainty on your objectives.

The trainer had prior knowledge of the University's Risk Management Policy and Risk Register, so he underpinned those two by the fundamentals of risk management and highlighted that they are already compliant to a great extent with the guidelines in the ISO 31000:2018 Standard.





He basically explained that the University is following the FMEA model, which stands for Failure Mode Effect Analysis, i.e. what would happen if we fail to attain our objective or if we fail our process? He then moved on to explain risk identification, risk assessment and risk treatment, clarifying that the ultimate objective of risk management is to achieve quality and

continuous improvement. In fact, he explained that while "Quality" is commonly defined in "positive terms" such as "achieve customer satisfaction and continuous improvement", there is another definition in "negative terms": "Quality is the absence of defects, deficiencies and variations (in output quality)". Risk management, indeed, aims to reduce defects, deficiencies and variations by predicting, anticipating, detecting early on, and preventing any potential failures that could lead to that.

At the end, he showed the spectrum of where organizations stand in terms of risk management. Through sound and effective risk management, the objective for any organization is to move from a reactive organization to a proactive one, and then from a proactive organization to a predictive one.
