The College of Arts and Science started the research seminars for the academic year 2019/2020 where its planning to conduct a series of research seminars in different areas of interior design, graphic design, computer science and general literature topics.

ASU Celebrates Becoming the First University in Bahrain and the Gulf to Achieve the ISO 21001:2018 Certification

The Applied Science University celebrated on Sunday 27 October 2019 the achievement of the ISO 21001:2018 Certification after successfully passing the various audits from the certifying body RICI (Resource Inspection Canada Incorporated), including a 2-day site visit on 6 and 7 October 2019, verifying that all the requirements of the International Standard ISO 2001:2018 are fully met by the University. This is a unique achievement as it makes ASU the first university, public or private, to receive this prestigious international certification in the Kingdom of Bahrain and in the Gulf region as a whole.

This achievement is in line with the University's strategic plan for the upcoming years, which focuses on achieving international recognition of the total quality of its programs, services and premises, designed to offer the students an empowering environment that fosters creativity and innovation, self-reliance and life-long learning. This is also in line with the strategic goals of the Higher Education Council and Bahrain 2030 which aim at making Bahrain a preferred destination for seekers of good quality education regionally and globally.

It is worth noting that the ISO 21001:2018 Standard for the Educational Organizations Management Systems (EOMS) was developed to help educational institutions establish the necessary policies and procedures which would ensure that students, staff (academic and administrative), and other beneficiaries' needs, requirements and objectives are met – and at the same time, the interaction between these interested parties and the educational organization is elevated to a successful level for all parties involved. Getting this certification confirms again ASU's strong commitment to continuous improvement of its management systems and the constant development of its academic and administrative staff capacity to offer its students the best educational experience possible.

This achievement represents a new milestone in the series of the University's recent accomplishments, and it will surely motivate everyone at the University to keep working hard to consolidate its status as a world-class institution capable of attracting students from inside and outside Bahrain, thus enhancing the Kingdom's position as a premier educational destination in the region and the world.

ASUrise Advance HE Scheme-Cohort 3 Introductory Session

At the Academic Staff Development Unit, we adopt an approach to fit and prepare the academic staff members with the skills and capabilities required for the most modern trends in higher education. To achieve this, it was the partnership with the UK Higher Education Academy that enabled us to establish a certified HEA Scheme center (ASUrise) to qualify our academic and admin staff for recognition of three Advance HE categories, namely, AFHEA, FHEA, and SFHEA. The aim of this approach was get academics acquainted with UKPSF and prepare a third cohort, after the great success of the first and second cohorts, to apply for the Advance HE through a series of preparation workshops from our experts, and managing the internal sessions, following up the application writing process throughout its different stages, and planning and organizing the mentoring and feedback processes.

For this purpose, ASDU organized the introductory session for the third cohort of ASUrise Advance HE Scheme on Thursday, October 31, 2019 at 11:00 am at the Dome Hall. The session was divided into three parts, with the first part dedicated to an introduction and welcoming speech for Prof. Khaled Gharaibeh, Acting Senior Advisor to President for Academic Affairs and Development, followed by an explanation of the scheme and process structure by Dr. Faiza Zitouni, the Assistant VP for Academic Affairs and Development and Ms. Michelle Philip, the Scheme Administrator. The speeches included a brief idea about the different categories and dimensions of the scheme, along with the criteria and requirements of each one.

The session was concluded by some success stories of successful applicants from Cohort 1 and 2.

Dr. Ahmed Shatat, SFHEA, talked about the following:

Critical Success Factors

Proper Guidance and Support: ASUrise team, mentor, self-learning and guidance, examples, documents, and website.

Very clear RPA: you should feel the impact of the activities, and clearly see the tangible value of your activities. Make a right Mapping of the Activities with the knowledge and value (accurate connection of the dimensions).

Robust Cases: selecting the right case is something very crucial, think of good cases and link them to the right references, advocates.

Teamwork: find out the applicants in the same category and see their progress.

Time Management: put a schedule for yourself and work on it, give time to write the application. Start from day one, don't write the application in the last week.

Lessons Learnt:

(The Standard of Quality of Teaching will definitely improve)

- I have learned to link theory to practices.
- I have learned to behave in the class as a facilitator more than a teacher (put students in a group, group leader, minutes taker, presenter, and this will be rotated among the students).
- I have also learned to use the technology as a platform for teaching. This will facilitate the communication between the instructor and the students, and among the students themselves.

Mr. Hatem Al Dammak, AFHEA, gave very helpful advises to the new applicants:

- First of all, I didn't get the recognition straight after the first submission, but I had to make some improvements and re-submit, further to which I obtained my recognition as AFHEA. That is perfectly okay; the external examiner may request further clarifications or more real personal examples to back your claim, and that means that he/she appreciates your work and would like to learn more about it.
- The submission is deeply personal and should reflect your own professional experience, so you really need to reflect on your own practice for the past few years and show the reviewers that you really know what you are doing.
- You should also be able to demonstrate that you are knowledgeable about the theories behind your practice and the latest trends in your field of work. One way to do this is to conduct some research, namely on Google Scholar which makes finding relevant references easier than ever.

- The bottom line is that you are required to a) demonstrate that you are knowledgeable about your own
 practice in your field of work b) demonstrate that you are knowledgeable about the theories underpinning
 your line of work c) successfully map your claims to the UK Professional Standards Framework (UKPSF).
- One challenge to be aware of is that this whole exercise is only available in English.
- The number of applicants per cohort is not unlimited due to resources' constraints, so this should be
 competitive and you should demonstrate passion and true willingness to participate in order to be chosen
 for the current cohort.

Once you achieve your HEA status, it's for life, and nobody can take it away from you, so believe me, it's really worth it!

Dr. Hafnida Hasan (FHEA) talked about the following

- The evidence that I mentioned in the report is not like writing a list or CV, but it must be clear on what you
 are doing, how you do and why you do, which reflect on my teaching process for the past few years
- Manage your time very well
- Follow the instruction and take the feedback from your mentor
- One challenge for this fellowship is limited sources
- Be committed to your own work, because the fellowship is not a box to tick but it provided me the
 opportunity to create improvement ofmy teaching which has benefitted not only for myself, but also my
 students and the others.

At the end session, attendees expressed their interests in the different ASUrise Scheme categories and they were informed about the process and how it would be going, a filtration process was to be conducted for the applicants and Cohort 3 participants would be notified by the end of this week, then they would be assigned their mentors. Within a week or 10 days, detailed workshops would follow to prepare them for the process.
