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Message from a Colleague

International Accreditation of Academic Programmes

It has become a necessity that universities worldwide seek accreditation to their academic programs by international professional bodies such as ABET and IET for engineering programs, AACSB and FIBAA for business programs, AAALAC for agricultural programs, ACEN for nursing, NASAD for arts, British Computer Society for computer science, CIOB for construction programs, etc.

In addition to enhancing the international reputation of the academic program, the school or the academic institution as a whole, international accreditation has become a tool for improving the quality of teaching and learning processes, ensuring that the academic program is up to the international standard and that students are equipped with required skills in the job market. In general, international accreditation serves the interest of students in many ways. Firstly, students graduated from accredited programs find it easy to introduce their educational background to employers and other academic institutions if they seek postgraduate studies. Secondly, accreditation by a reputable professional body plays a major role in the decision of students and parents to join a certain academic program of study as being a graduate of an accredited program means better job opportunities. Finally, accreditation helps students become licensed professionals by professional bodies as most of these bodies require the applicants to be graduates of internationally accredited programs.

For all this, and despite the tedious process and the incurred costs, most universities have become interested in seeking international accreditation for their academic programs. The process of obtaining an international accreditation, for example AACSB, involves aligning the business program to a set of accreditation standards that focus on mission and strategic management; support for students, faculty, and staff; learning and teaching; and academic and professional engagement of students and faculty.



Professor Khaled M. Gharaibeh President's Senior Advisor for Academic Affairs and Development

Prof. Khaled M. Gharaibeh received his B.S. and M.S. in Electrical Engineering in 1995 and 1998 respectively, both from Jordan University of Science and Technology, Irbid, Jordan and his PhD in Electrical Engineering in 2004 from North Carolina State University, Raleigh, NC. He joined Yarmouk University, Irbid, Jordan in 2005 where he became full professor of Telecommunications Engineering in 2017 and held a number of administrative positions such as Head of Department, Assistant Dean, and Dean of Engineering. Since Jan 2019, he joined ASU as Senior Advisor to the President for Academic Affairs and Development. He is senior member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineering (IEEE), Microwave Theory and Techniques Society (MTTS), Jordan Engineers Association and the honor society Eta Kappa Nu.

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To obtain accreditation by AACSB, the business school must submit an eligibility application where a business school is assessed with respect to six eligibility criteria, namely:

- 1. Ethical Behavior
- 2. Collegiate Environment,
- 3. Commitment to corporate and social responsibility
- 4. Accreditation Scope and AACSB membership
- 5. Oversight, sustainability and continuous improvement
- Policy and Continued Adherence to Standards and Integrity of submissions to AACSB

Once the eligibility of the business school is established, it goes through a self-evaluation and peer review processes where the school is evaluated with regard to achieving AACSB accreditation standards. If the school passes the evaluation process, it becomes an AACSB school which must undergo a continuous improvement review process every five years.

ASU should be no exception to those academic institutions which seek international accreditation as it is of high priority that the university builds on its great achievements in the recent years (specially passing the local QA reviews and the international ISO certification), in order to ensure the sustainability of its success and enhance its international reputation and its student intake.

Ms. Eman presented the methodology of developing the new strategic plan which starts with the vision and ends with the strategic objectives and the corresponding KPIs tree.


The session was a success given the useful data which was gathered which will be used in formulating the new vision, mission, objectives and values of the new strategic plan of the university.
