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Message from a Colleague Human Rights Day

The world celebrated the International Human Rights Day, on the 10th of December. This date also marks a new international achievement for the Kingdom of Bahrain, as Bahrain was elected as a member of the United Nations Human Rights Council for the period 2019-2021, after receiving 165 out of 192 votes.

Professor Jafar Elmughrabi is the Acting Dean of the College of Law at ASU. In 2000, he received his PhD degree in Law from Ain Shamas University, Egypt and became a Professor in 2011 in Mu'tah University in Law, Jordan. Professor Jafar is an active member of the Arab Bar Association and a lawyer since 2007 till date. He have published 2 books one titled " Civil liability for assaulting the right to a photo by mobile phone: and the other is "Explanation the provision of labor law"

The Human Rights Council is made of 47 Member States, which are elected by the majority of members of the General Assembly of the United Nations through direct and secret ballot. It is no secret to anyone that this victory is a new achievement added to the record of the Kingdom's high level achievements and the great progress achieved in the field of human rights in the Kingdom of Bahrain the cradle of many civilizations that extends throughout history and its human heritage is a forum for coexistence.

The reform project of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, launched since 2001, affirmed that the approach to respect for human rights is a strategy pursued by the Kingdom of Bahrain in strengthening the state of institutions and cooperation. The national legislation came to reflect respect for rights and freedoms, for example, legislation related to freedom of opinion and belief, and ensuring the rights of national and foreign workers and criminalizing human trafficking. In addition to the Kingdom of Bahrain joining many regional and international agreements that promote respect for human rights and the need to respect the rule of law.


It is worth noting that the National Institution for Human Rights in the Kingdom of Bahrain is an independent institution dedicated to the promotion, development and protection of human rights. It also works to receive complaints related to human rights, study and investigate them, and then transfer them to the competent authorities with effective follow-up and then inform the concerned parties of the procedures to be followed and help settle them with the relevant authorities.

Scenario Planning

Scenario planning (sometimes called "scenario and contingency planning") is a structured way for organisations to think about the future. A number of scenarios, usually around three to four, could be developed in order to be well prepared for an unpredictable future. This is not a forecasting technique but one that could help organisations be prepared for the future. For instance, a university can look at various scenarios because of the trends in evolving national strategies or impact of introducing new technologies like AI, Internet of Things, or any others. The steps to develop scenarios include:

- Identify the driving forces
- Identify the critical uncertainties
- Develop a range of plausible scenarios
- Discuss the implications

An illustration of various scenarios about learning is included below; this is used only to illustrate how scenario planning works.





A common mistake is to develop one particular scenario and assume it will happen and build the strategy around it. It is vital to include scenario planning as part of the development of any strategic plan. However, we should be cautious about adopting a particular scenario.
