Message from a Colleague Employability Skills Readiness among ASU Students

Employability Skills are becoming very important in the labor market as there are many initiatives toward linking the graduates' skills and the needs of the market. Toward, this aim, the higher education institutions are dedicating many efforts to integrate the goal of graduate employability into current higher education practices. Saad and Majid (2014, p.111) referred employability skills to "graduates' abilities to adapt and use their personal and academic skills to create more tangible educational outcomes that associate graduate employability with employment". Skills such as communication, problem-solving, decision-making, analytical and critical thinking, synthesizing information, teamwork, interpersonal, and continuous learning are some of the employability skill attributes required by graduates in entering the workforce (Low et al., 2016).

Evidence from researchers suggests that there is a gap between the employability skills required by employers and the available skills from employees. Therefore, the higher education institutions have the responsibility to provide graduates with knowledge in the professional field with the employability skills so they can apply theory to practical situations.

Thus, they need to design and implement programs that are aligned with the goals of the market and prepare the graduates that are relevant to the needs of employers.

ASU strives to prepare its graduates to the market by working hardly on equipping them with fundamental graduate attributes which include being critical thinkers, entrepreneurially spirited enjoying practical work, knowledgeable and skills in their field, effective communicators, team players, proficient practitioners and collaborators, ethically and socially responsible and committed to lifelong learning.

At ASU, these attributes are empowered through teaching and assessment practices that are aligned with many areas including knowledge and understanding, practical, critical thinking and transferrable skills. Furthermore, the employability skills are enhanced through the extra-curricular activities that are organized by the academic colleges and other parties of ASU including the Deanship of Student Affairs Community Engagement Office, Business Incubation Center, Training Center, etc.

Dr Hayat Ali is the acting dean of Student Affairs at ASU. She got her PhD in Business Administration (Information Systems Division) from the University of Manchester in Nov 2010.

Computer Science Programme Held Its Advisory Board Meeting for the 1st Semester 2019/2020

On Tuesday, 24th Dec 2019, the Computer Science Department held its advisory board meeting at ASU. Prof. Ayman AlDmoor - Acting Dean of the College of Arts and Science, Dr. Moaiad Khder - Head of Department of Computer Science, Dr. Jamal Sultan - CS Program leader attended as members, while Prof. Khalid Gharaibeh- Acting VP for Academic Affairs, Prof. Hilal AlBayatti - Director of QAAC, Prof Yazeed Al-Sbou- Dean of Scientific Research and Post Graduate studies, attended as invited guests. External members from the industrial field: Sh. Dr. Eshaa AlKhalifa, Mr. Nizar Ma'roof, Mr. Nawaf AbdulRahman, Ms. Maha AlBanki have attended the Computer Science Department advisory board meeting.

Chair of the CS advisory board Mr. Nawaf AbdulRahman started the meeting by welcoming the audience and in particular the newly joined member Sh. Dr. Eshaa Alkhalifa – Chair of IEEE – Bahrain Section. The ASU programme advisory board policy was distributed to all the members and soft copies sent via email. Later on, Prof. Khalid Gharaibeh presented the University's strategic plan to the advisory board and discussed the strategic objectives and KPIs, the Seven Strategic Pillars, Development Implementation and Monitoring, and the role of the advisory board in the strategic plan specially that the University now is preparing the new strategic plan. In addition to that, Prof. Ayman Aldmoor informed the advisory board about the college operational plan (including CS) and how it was prepared along with its KPIs. Dr. Moaiad and Dr. Jamal presented the progress of the CS programme since the last advisory meeting, and they showed the improvement plan based on the advisory board meetings during the academic year 2018/2019, external reviewer report 2018/2019 feedback and comments, the results of the Annual Program Review Report (APRR) / 2018-2019, and the progress of placing CS programme on the National Qualification Frame (NQF).

The CS members and invited guests had a discussion with the advisory board about the demand for Computer Science programme and its usefulness for Bahraini market. Sh. Dr. Eshaa, Mr. Nizar Ma'roof, Mr. Nawaf AbdulRahman, and Ms. Maha AlBanki highlighted how to take advantage of the different IT sectors in Bahrain, scientific societies and increase the cooperation between governmental, NGO, scientific societies and ASU. In addition they highlighted some methods to strengthen the relationships between the department and the industry as well as offering internship opportunities.


