LSBU-ASU Entrepreneurship Programme 2021: Recap of Session 3: Creativity & Idea Generation

Following the article published last week summarizing the second session of the LSBU-ASU Entrepreneurship Programme 2021, in this week's article I will summarize the key ideas and takeaways from the third session (there are 8 sessions in total).

In this session, the Programme Leaders, Ms. Alison Price and Ms. Lisa McMullan, focused on the activities revolving around "Idea Generation", as part of the second outcome of the programme "Explore and adapt a range of pedagogy/teaching techniques to support the business start-up process". The session was meant to be a highly interactive session providing opportunities to try out a range of idea generation techniques.

But firstly, the session started with a recap of the teaching techniques that can be used at the classroom (physical or virtual) that we have seen so far:

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Teaching Techniques so far:

- 1. Lecture
- 2. Guest Speakers
- 3. Team teaching
- 4. Panel of guests /alumni
- 5. Q&A
- 6. Video
- 7. Images visual depictions
- 8. Mind Maps
- 9. Sharing view points/words
- 10. Guests to interview each other / guest
- 11. "no prep" guest (audience ask questions)
- 12. Voting (raise hands or cards *see photo)
- 13. Tasks/activities (MAIR, SWOT, YOOP.fi) group or individual
- 14. Reflection What? so what? now what? What else?
- 15. Hand outs review and reflect (apply to action planning)



And then we dived deeper into the idea generation exercises and techniques that the lecturer can use to stimulate the students and challenge them to come up with new business ideas.

One of the techniques is to focus on problems ands then try to find solutions namely by using the SCAMPER Process:

- S: Substitute: what can you substitute to create a new solution to the problem (material, process, place, ingredient? Etc.)
- C: Combine: What can you combine or bring together somehow? How about a blend, an alloy, an assortment, an ensemble?
- A: Adapt: What can you adapt for use as a solution? What else is like this? What other idea does this suggest? What could I possibly emulate?
- M: Modify, Minify or Magnify: Can you change the item in some way? Change meaning, color, motion, sound, form, shape? What can you add? More time? Greater frequency? Stronger? Higher? Extra value? Multiply? Exaggerate? What can you remove? Smaller? Condensed? Miniature? Lower? Shorter? Lighter? Streamline?
- P: Put to Another Use: Can you use this product somewhere else, perhaps in another industry? Could you recycle the waste from this product to make something new?
- **E: Eliminate:** What can you eliminate? Eliminate waste? Reduce time? Reduce effort? Cut costs? How could you streamline or simplify this product?
- **R: Reverse:** What can be rearranged in some way? Other pattern? Other layout? Other sequence? Transpose cause and effect? Change pace? Change schedule?

Finally, it is worth noting that we had a guest speaker during the session who is no other than Dr. Safia Barikzai, Associate Professor at LSBU, who was a **PRECIOUS Awards 2016** finalist in the **'Outstanding Woman in STEM'** category. She talked about her experience in teaching Engineering students innovation and creativity through fun practical activities, some of them based on the LEGO bricks, and demonstrated that not only kids but also adults learn better when they are doing fun practical activities.

A Busy Week for ASDU












A Memory to Remember
