#### Highlights of the series of webinars delivered by LSBU .:

#### Decision-Making in Uncertain & High-Risk Environments (Delivered by Mr. Hitendra Solanki Dr Andrew Whittaker)

Decision-Making in Uncertain & High-Risk Environments: Decision making in uncertain and high-risk environments, and during critical incidents can be difficult, particularly during a Pandemic. For academics and key personnel, making decisions without all the facts can be stressful, and many people are reluctant to make decisions at such times, often with serious consequences. This is particularly true in crisis management, when time is of the essence. This has major implications for individuals, and in particular, for institutions such as the Higher Education Sector, particularly during the Pandemic. The brief of the webinars covers the summary of the latest developments in the field of decision-making, from the worlds of science, psychology, business, and neuroscience, to provide a grounding in the current thinking, practice, and application on how we make decisions at an individual level, and critically, how these can be applied at an organizational level, with a particular view in the academic arena. This heightened awareness, of ourselves, and the world around us, in turn, can support us in understanding and recognizing our cognitive tendencies and the external information available to us. This is an important skill in the decision-making process for individuals in academia, in teaching and supporting learning.

#### Benchmarking, (Delivered by Mr. Chris Crampton)

The webinars covered the following topics : (i) How to develop a new academic program; (ii) what is a proper benchmark;

(ii) feasibility study; (iii) market needs analysis; (iv) how do we know the program is viable for the marketplace? Main keys considerations/ highlights:

- Quality, Certifications, Industry exemptions, Benchmarks
- Understanding the context, market and benchmarking
- Secondary Sources including governmental, industry, professional body and general data
- Primary sources of data; Metrics, Choices, Issues; People, Finance, Offerings, and Process
- Subject Benchmark Statements describe the nature of study and the academic standards
- Graduate attributes; what graduates might reasonably be expected to know, do and understand at the end of their studies?)
- Reference points in the design, delivery and review of academic programmes.

#### Academic Leadership (Delivered by Dr Loua Khalil, Ms. Faye Kilgour)

The workshops covered a brief pragmatic approach to equip academic leaders with the right skills to improve their personal and professional performances.
