




Meeting with HE Dr. Md. Nazrul Islam Ambassador of Bangladesh to Bahrain

Throughout the year, We have worked closely with other entities at ASU to be able to make I Dr. Marwan Aouad, Acting Vice things happen. We are grateful for the support we have received from the Leadership Leadership Dean, College of Engineering Team, Marketing and Public Relations, Finance and Administration, Admission and Registration, International Partnerships, and Deanship of Student Affairs.

Let us share with you the main accomplishments of the College this year:

- Our Civil and Architectural Engineering programmes have been successfully delivered along with 19 students completing the requirements for their graduation this year.
- We are launching two new programmes in partnership with LSBU, one in Mechanical Engineering and one in Electrical and Electronic Engineering. We have identified the academic staff and the equipment needed for a good start in September.
- LSBU has conducted a comprehensive periodic review of our Civil and Architectural Engineering programmes and has given us high commendations on the quality of the programmes we have delivered.
- We have completed the alignment of our Civil and Architectural Engineering programmes with the National Qualification Framework (NQF) of the Education and Training Quality Authority in Bahrain.
- We are in the final stages to submit the applications for the accreditation of our Civil and Architectural Engineering programmes by the Chartered Institute of Building (CIOB).
- We have prepared all the needed documents for the internal audit of our college conducted by a QAAC committee.
- We have completed a successful internship programme led by Dr. Hamdy and Dr. Faiza with full documentation including videos and photos of our students at their project sites that were posted on social
- For the first time, our students have participated in a summer school at LSBU in London with our students praising the workshops conducted and the experiences they had in London. This effort was led by Dr. Faiza.
- We have participated in several successful events throughout the year including the Engineering Day, London Day and Career Day. We encourage you to visit our posts on social media to have an appreciation of the quality of these events.
- Our students have participated in the ASU Students Conference with high recognition of the papers presented by the College of Engineering students.
- We have published several articles in the President's News Digest to give information about our programmes, and give exposure to the activities occurring in the college.
- We have published a large number of papers in conferences and journals and have participated in several conferences.
- We have successfully completed the External Exam Board on July 17 -18 with participation from LSBU and external examiners from other universities.




Are you ready for summer vacation?
