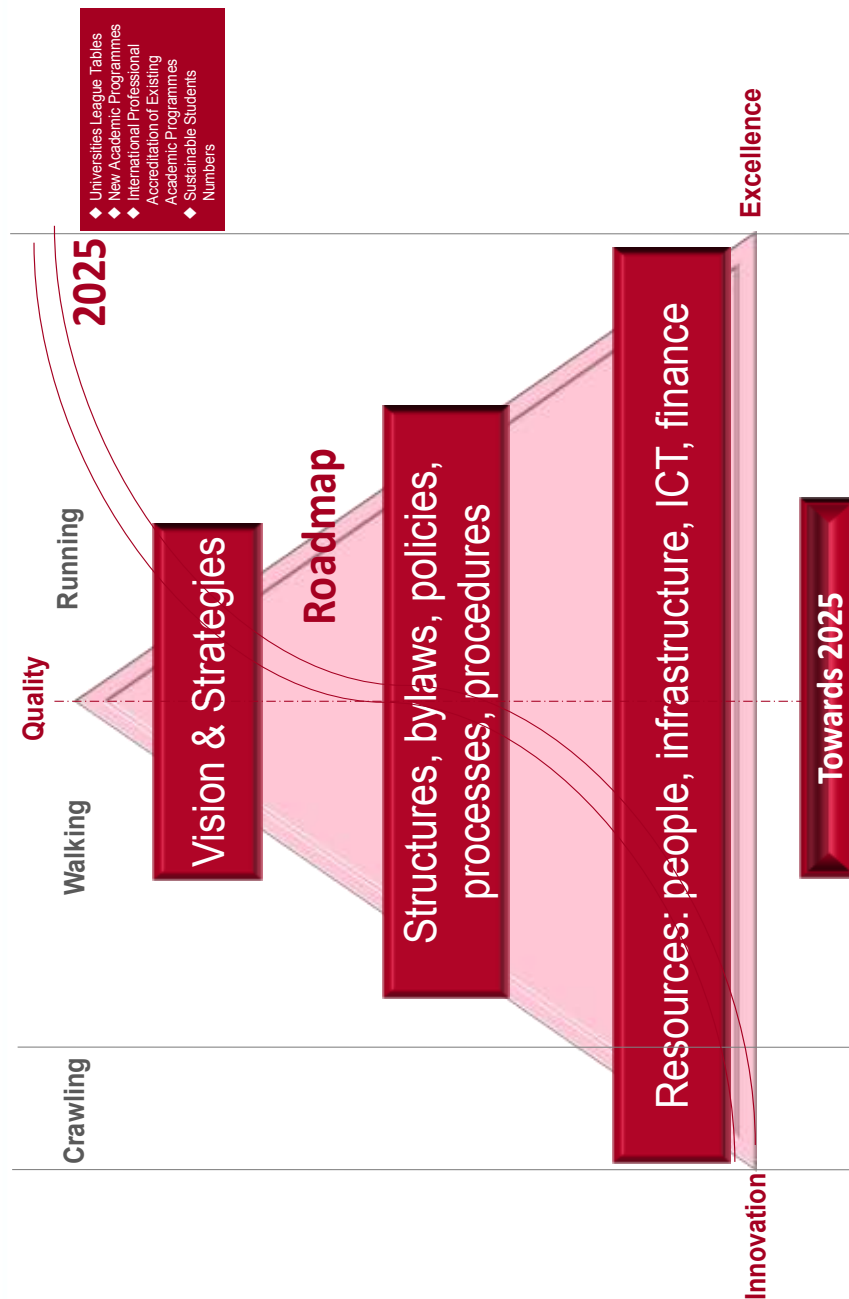

Affirmative sentences

I	work	at Applied Science University.
You		
He		
She	works	
It		
We	work	
You		
They

Most verbs add -s in the third person singular (he/she/it).

I work à He works
You read à She reads
They play à It plays

Exceptions:

-es	If the verb ends in -o	I go à He goes You do à She does
-es	If the verb ends in -ss, -sh, -ch, -x, -zz	I finish à He finishes You watch à She watches
-ies	If the verb ends in a <i>consonant</i> +-y	I study à He studies You fly à It flies
Irregular	Have	I have à He has

Negative sentences – We use the auxiliary (helping) verb to do

					<i>Short form</i>
I	do	not	work	at Applied Science University.	I don't work at ASU.
You					You don't work at ASU.
He					He doesn't work at ASU.
She	She doesn't work at ASU.				
It	It doesn't work at ASU.				
We	We don't work at ASU.				
You	You don't work at ASU.				
They	They don't work at ASU.				

Interrogative sentences (Questions) We use the auxiliary (helping) verb to do

Yes/No questions		Short answers
	Do you work at ASU?	Yes, I do. No, I don't.
	Does she work at ASU?	Yes, she does. No, he doesn't.

WH-word questions	Where do you work?
	When does the movie start?
	How many siblings do you have?
