REMINDER OF THE WEEK:

THE INSTITUTIONAL ACCREDITATION STANDARDS (HEC)



AREA 4: Research and Innovation (2 Standards)

The institution must demonstrate a commitment to research and provide adequate and appropriate facilities to promote research (4 KIs)

- 1. The promotion and facilitation of research must be a central feature of the institution's overall strategic aims.
- 2. The interaction between research and education must be reflected in the curriculum, inform current teaching, and encourage and prepare students for engagement in research, scholarship and innovative development.
- 3. There must be policies which identify the priorities, facilities and development in research and commercialization.
- 4. Incentives must be provided for the academic staff and the departments to conduct research.

The institution must encourage and support its staff to undertake research and other forms of scholarship and to engage in other professional activities (10 KIs)

- 1. The institution must have well-defined policies and procedures for the undertaking of academic research and these are communicated effectively to all relevant stakeholders.
- 2. Institutions must include in their research policies a reference to the link between research development and commercialization.
- 3. The research strategy of the institution must be in line with national priorities.





- 4. Teachers must be encouraged and supported to undertake research in relevant fields and to publish their findings.
- 5. The institution must maintain a catalogue of up-to-date publications which are published on the website.
- 6. Academic staff contracts must require academic staff to engage in research and scholarship relevant to their teaching and other duties.
- 7. Appointment and promotion criteria and faculty performance evaluations must reflect the institution's expectations for faculty research and scholarly activity.
- 8. Academic staff must be encouraged to seek out international universities or employers in order to develop collaborative relationships.
- 9. There must be a fair and transparent procedure for staff to seek financial support for their research and other professional development activities.
- 10. The institution must provide time for staff to meet regularly to share and discuss current research activities and, if appropriate, invite external speakers.
