My family in Lebanon, including my late parents God Bless their souls and brothers and sisters who sacrificed everything for our education.


Professor Waheeb Alkhaja, my good friend and boss and the current chairman of the board of trustees at the University in Bahrain and colleagues at Applied Science University.
